HANOVER SAFE PLACE

FORKIDS

Located in 14 cities throughout Southeastern Virginia, is ForKlds. This organization was created to provide emergency shelter to families and children. ForKids has become one of the largest providers to help families thrive.

Through the commitment of using data driven, trauma-informed, and dedicated team members, ForKids is helping stabilize families so these families can grow roots. Their mission is: Breaking the cycle of homelessness and poverty for families and children.

There are three main services ForKids provides, and they are housing, education, and critical services. Categorized within these three main services are customized instruction, mentoring, after school tutoring, job coaching, mental health coordination, case management, and financial opportunity programs.

Strive and Aspire are two forms of programs to help build financial knowledge and increase family wealth. Strive helps to increase housing stability, increase income, and takes approximately 12-18 months to graduate from. Aspire aims to help participants save \$1500, focus on living wage income and takes three years to complete. Their online data shows that program graduates increase their income by approximately \$19,000, pay off an average of \$17,000 in debt, and gain an estimated \$10,000 in assets.

For Kids also hosted VPEP, during the 2023 Birth Registrar Training. The event was a success and the staff were pleasant, professional, and inspiring.
